
















Central Kitchens Support Process Map

- In Khartoum
- Approximately 4,700 families
- 16 central kitchens across Khartoum

Expanded:

- 5 States
- 52 Kitchens and IDP Centers
- 9,872 Families Daily
- 59,232 Beneficiaries daily
- 240,247,000 SDG (193,735 USD)
- 1,100 food baskets for Sudanese refugees' families in Chad and Egypt






Kitchens in Khartoum State
